CMPX 2022 returns after 4 years:

The Canadian Mechanical & Plumbing Exposition (CMPX) opens this Wednesday March 23rd marking an exciting return for the industry to showcase new products and services in HVACR and plumbing. The biennial show has not run since 2018 due to Covid 19.

The trade only show will be held March 23, 24 & 25 at the North Building of the Metro Toronto Convention Centre.

Jointly produced by the Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Institute of Canada (HRAI) and the Canadian Institute of Plumbing & Heating (CIPH), the event is a celebration of the industry, complete with educational sessions, demonstrations, and hundreds of new products in air-conditioning, forced-air and hydronic heating, plumbing, waterworks, water quality, piping, refrigeration, and ventilation.

“We couldn't be more pleased to re-open our doors so industry manufacturers, wholesalers and contractors can come together and conduct business face-to-face.” says Sandy MacLeod, President of HRAI.

The show dedicated to the mechanical and plumbing industries will host 1000's of mechanical and plumbing contractors, engineers, building maintenance, architects, and other industry professionals.

The show will follow all Ontario Government regulations at the time of the show. CMPX show organizers have put protocols in place to ensure a safe environment including signage to remind visitors that masks are optional but recommended, hand sanitizers throughout the show and ribbons for visitors to attach to their badge to show how they feel about social distancing and touching.

The CMPX Show runs March 23 and 24 from 10:00am to 6:00pm and March 25 from 10:00am to 4:00pm, at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre, North Building, 255 Front Street West. Toronto ON.
